

Class of 1990 Scholarship & CASE Summer Internship Program

Class of 1990 Scholarship. The Duke MBA Daytime Class of 1990 established an endowment to provide assistance to current first-year students who choose a summer internship with a nonprofit, public, or small to medium size company. The annual amount available for this scholarship depends on endowment earnings. The maximum scholarship awarded to a single recipient is \$4,000, or up to \$400 per week for up to ten weeks. An award committee of relevant Fuqua staff members reviews applications and selects the scholarship winners, with priority going to students with internships with (1) nonprofit organizations, (2) public agencies, and (3) small to medium size companies, in that order of preference. Should the award committee decide to name more than one student to receive this scholarship, the committee will determine the amount awarded per student. The scholarship is given in the form of a tuition credit and will be disbursed for the fall semester 2010 as a credit to the student's account in the University Bursar's Office.

CASE Summer Internship Program. Thanks to the generous support of the Duke MBA Net Impact Club Summer Internship Fund (SIF) fundraising events and "Give-A-Day" campaign, The Wachovia Foundation, and other donors, CASE provides financial assistance to first-year students who pursue summer internships with nonprofit organizations and public agencies. A committee of CASE staff reviews applications and selects the fund recipients. Students who are selected for the CASE Summer Internship Program will receive funds from the CASE SIF to match the stipends provided by their summer employers, up to \$400 per week for up to ten weeks. The maximum award from the CASE Summer Internship Program is \$4,000 per participant per summer, with the amount awarded per student dependent upon both the level of direct compensation and availability of and demand for funding. Additional funds may be dispersed above the stated maximum if available. The award is made in the form of a check disbursed in June or July. Applying for these Awards. To apply for the Class of 1990 Scholarship or the CASE Summer Internship Program, you must complete the application form and write a one-page essay (this is a joint application form). The essay must describe the type of internship being pursued, community and Fuqua school involvement, and your career objectives. Attach your resume and a copy of your summer internship offer letter. All application materials (application form, essay, resume, and offer letter) should be completed and submitted **as soon as you have accepted an internship offer, or by April 5, 2010**, which is the final date to apply for the Class of 1990 Scholarship and CASE Summer Internship Program. If you have not received an internship offer by April 5th, you should submit your application describing any relevant internships being pursued. CASE will continue to review applications until all funds are expended.

Students with internships in nonprofit organizations or public agencies should submit applications to Ruth Tolman, CASE Assistant Director (ruth.tolman@duke.edu).

The award committees reserve the right to share information and confer upon the value of awards. Students may be awarded support from both the Class of 1990 Scholarship and the CASE Summer Internship Program, up to a combined total of \$4,000 per recipient per summer. Total summer compensation from all sources, including the employer-provided stipend, may not exceed \$8,000.

All applicants will be notified when the selection decisions are made. Class of 1990 Scholarship decisions will be made by May 3, 2010. CASE will make decisions on a rolling basis as applications are received. The selected recipients must provide confirmation of their internship (in the form of an offer letter or the equivalent) to ensure eligibility before funds will be awarded.
